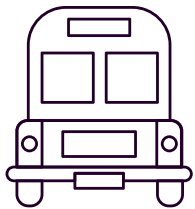


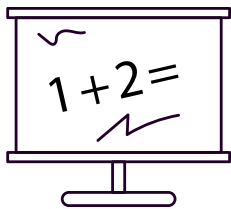
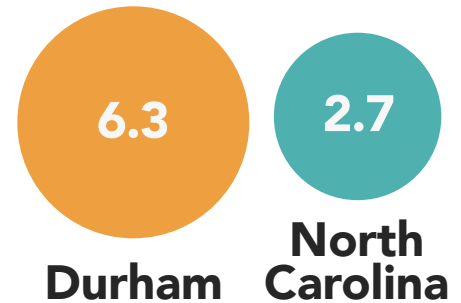

Durham County



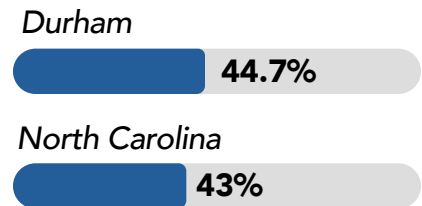
ACCESS TO CHILDCARE²

The percentage of children ages 3 to 4 enrolled in school.



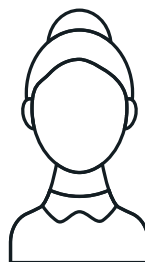
FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE LUNCH¹

19% of people under the age of 18 are in poverty in Durham, compared to **20%** in North Carolina.

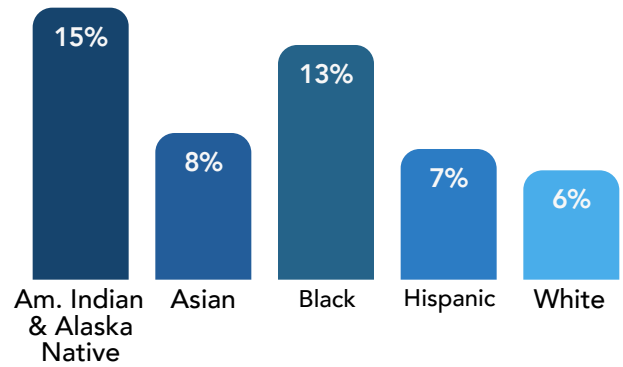


CHILDREN WITH SINGLE PARENTS¹

45% of children live in a household headed by a single parent in Durham, compared to **35%** in North Carolina.

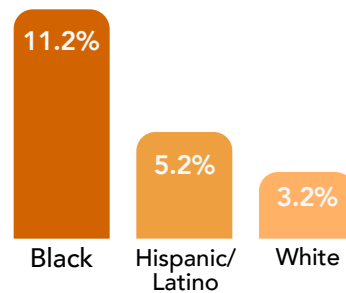
Low Birthweight¹

Percentage of live births with low birthweight (< 2,500 grams), by race and ethnicity in Durham County:



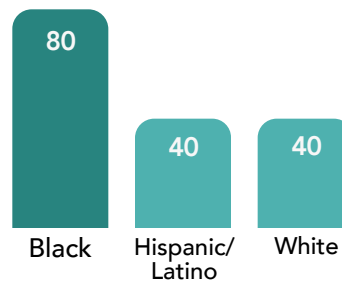
Infant Mortality³
