Food Access & Education — Helping Triangle residents access affordable and nutritious food and creating a culture of healthy eating. Healthy Communities — Supporting health and wellness initiatives that positively promote the physical and mental well-being of individuals and their communities. Projects must address one of the following issues: chronic illnesses, mental health, obesity, sexual & reproductive health (maternal health, sexually transmitted infections, teen pregnancy), substance abuse. Population to be served - The majority of the people served by the project represent those historically experiencing health inequities. (Ex.
